Residency	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Resident in the USA or territories (American Samoa; Guam; the Northern Mariana Islands; Puerto Rico; United States Virgin Islands)
WPATH Membership	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student Member of the World Professional Association for Transgender Health (WPATH) for at least 1 year, in good standing (Membership paid in 2022 and 2023), prior to the nomination • Supports the mission of WPATH/USPATH
Ethics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Members shall act in accordance with the ethical standards set by professional specialty boards or other professional societies where they hold certification or membership • Adhere to the ethical guidelines for members of WPATH • Support the SOC and evidence-based practice
Leadership Experience	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Previous leadership experience or an understanding of the roles and responsibilities of board members • Has competency, skills and experience needed on the board
Personal Commitment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Able to attend meetings regularly • Can dedicate approximately 20 hours per month to board duties • Can commit to a 2-year term • Understands the mission and vision of USPATH
Conflicts of interest	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No conflicts of interest • Committed to a broad agenda to improving transgender health
Diversity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Commitment to diversity and inclusiveness
Consensus	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maintains a collegial working relationship with other board members • Commitment to consensus building
Board makeup	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Board of Directors, which includes ten (10) at large members, one (1) student member and three (3) Officers of the organization: Including the President, President Elect and a Secretary/Treasurer
