Committee Description

Curriculum Development Committee (OPENING: Mental Health Co-Lead)

The Curriculum Development Committee focuses on establishing the core curricular components in transgender health. The GEI curriculum framework is based on a set of four competency domains that have global applicability: Patient/Client-Caregiver Relationship; Content Knowledge; Interdisciplinary Practice; and Professional Responsibility.

Committee work will include establishing objectives that map to the standardized competency-based framework such that the experiences of trainees can be uniform independent of trainers. The committee's work will serve to assist trainers by maintaining educational resources (e.g., cases to discuss in training programs). The committee will also work to update core curricular components to remain consistent with the SOC and with new literature in the field as it emerges.

GEI Committee Co-Lead Criteria

We are particularly seeking Committee Co-Leads who will broaden and deepen the diversity of Leaders in the GEI in such areas as geographically diverse regions, trans/gender diverse identity, race, ethnicity, age, abilities, professions, languages spoken, and more. We strongly encourage WPATH members familiar with GEI courses and Certification to apply for these volunteer opportunities.

Applicants for a GEI Committee Co-Lead position within the GEI Committee must meet the following requirements:

1. Be a WPATH member (full or emeritus) in good standing since 2022 (minimum 2 years of experience in WPATH).
2. Sign a statement agreeing to support the latest version of the WPATH Standards of Care.
3. Sign a statement agreeing to adhere to the latest version of the WPATH Ethical Standards and a Code of Conduct.
